Course Description

This course is being designed and presented to meet course objectives for both E-965-All Hazards Resource Unit Leader, and S-349-Resource and Demobilization Unit Leader. The goal of this course is to provide local and state-level emergency responders with an overview of key duties and responsibilities of a RESL Type III in a Type III All-Hazards Incident Management Team (AHIMT), and also the specific duties and responsibilities associated with performing as a RESL or DMOB on Type 1 and Type 2 Agency or Interagency Incident Management Teams. These key responsibilities fall into three categories: 1) collecting and maintaining status information on incident resources, 2) making resource assignments to meet Operations Section requests, and 3) participating in the incident planning process to produce accurate and timely Incident Action Plans. Students will learn how to evaluate and plan for unit staffing needs; how to establish incident check-in and resource tracking systems; how to prepare resource status information for meetings and briefings; how to maintain displays, charts and lists that reflect the current status and location of resources; and how to participate in the operational planning process with other IMT members to create key components of the Incident Action Plan, and to assemble the IAP.

Target Audience

NIMS ICS Position Specific training should be completed by personnel who are regularly assigned to functional, support, or unit leader positions on USFA or other Type III All-Hazards Incident Management Teams, or by those persons who desire to seek credentials / certification in those positions. S-349 is targeted towards individuals seeking to meet NWCG (310-1) standards for the RESL and/or DMOB position.

Required Pre-Requisites for All Hazards Course

The National certification course requires students to have completed the following courses prior to attending: IS700; I-100, I-200, & I-300

I-400 is suggested; or Command and General Staff Functions for Local IMT's is an I-300 & 400 equivalent

Required Pre-Requisites for NWCG Course

Pre-Requisites for S-349 include:

Qualified as status/check-in recorder (SCKN).

Basic knowledge of current automated resource status system, such as I-Suite.
