Course Description

This course is being designed and presented to meet course objectives for both E-964, All Hazards Situation Unit Leader, and S-346, Situation Unit Leader. The goal of this course is to provide local- and state-level emergency responders with an overview of key duties and responsibilities of a SITL Type III in a Type III All-Hazards Incident Management Team (AHIMT), and also the specific duties and responsibilities associated with performing as a SITL on Type 1 and Type 2 Agency or Interagency Incident Management Teams. These key responsibilities fall into two categories: 1) collecting and processing information and intelligence, and 2) developing displays, reports and briefings on incident status. Students will learn how to evaluate and plan for unit staffing needs, how to collect and organize incident status and situation information; how to evaluate, analyze, and display information for use by incident management team personnel; how to participate effectively in incident planning processes; and how to prepare necessary materials and presentations for incident meetings, briefings and status reports.

Target Audience

NIMS ICS Position Specific training should be completed by personnel who are regularly assigned to functional, support, or unit leader positions on USFA or other Type III All-Hazards Incident Management Teams, or by those persons who desire to seek credentials / certification in those positions. S-346 is targeted towards individuals seeking to meet NWCG (310-1) standards for the SITL position.

Required Pre-Requisites for All Hazards Course

The National certification course requires students to have completed the following courses prior to attending: IS700; I-100, I-200, & I-300

I-400 is suggested; or Command and General Staff Functions for Local IMT's is an I-300 & 400 equivalent

Required Pre-Requisites for NWCG Course

Pre-Requisites for S-346 include:

Qualified as a Strike Team Leader or Incident Commander Type 4 (ICT4).
